Introduction

A report, entitled *"Key Largo Upland Leases"*, prepared in December 2017 identified certain issues with the legal description attached to the Lease 3671 Parent Lease to Monroe County for a fire station. A recommendation was made for a Partial Release of Lease to remedy these issues. Additional research of the Board of Trustees Land Document System (BTLDS), Bureau of Public Land Administration (BPLA) archives in the DEP Oculus database, and Monroe County Public Records was conducted to better understand the origin of the erroneous legal description and the original intent of the parties to the lease.

The issues with the current legal description of this lease include:

- 1) The description includes lands in Block 3 which the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund (TIITF) did not own when the lease was executed.
- 2) The description includes lots waterward of the Mean High Water Line in Block 1 which conflicts with Paragraph 32 of the lease.
- 3) The description overlaps an adjoining lease to the Division of Recreation and Parks (DRP) in Block 3 for the Florida Keys Overseas Heritage Trail.
- 4) There is no indication in the records reviewed that there was ever an intent by the parties to include conservation lands in this lease.

Additionally, there does not appear to be any land use plan or management plan for the conservation lands included in the current lease description.

Chronology of Acquisition and Parent Lease History

Lease 3671 consists of a portion of the Port Bougainville / Garden Cove tract in the North Key Largo Hammocks Conservation and Recreation Lands (CARL) project. On February 9, 1988, the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund (the Trustees) approved the Purchase Agreement to acquire the approximately 431-acre tract from the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) for \$23,200,000 from the CARL Trust Fund.

The Trustees approved an Amended Purchase Agreement on May 24, 1988 to exclude approximately 5.1 acres from the first closing pending resolution of outstanding title issues. The largest exclusion was described as an existing 99-year lease from a prior owner to Monroe County for about 3.5 acres. The County had subleased a portion of this to the Key Largo Volunteer Firemen for a fire station occupying 0.5 acres. Through negotiations, Monroe County had agreed to release its interest in the acreage if the Trustees would lease the current fire station site to the County and find an alternate site for the County's cable TV tower.

On December 20, 1988, the Trustees granted conceptual approval of a 50-year lease to Monroe County for 0.5 acres for the fire station. On the same day, the Monroe County Board of County Commissioners approved Resolution 681-1988 requesting a 30-year lease from the Trustees "on that certain property upon which the Key Largo Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department has located its facility".

On February 16, 1989, the Trustees approved a lease to Monroe County for 0.5 acres for a fire station contingent upon Monroe County's release of the 1974 lease.

An executed Quit Claim Deed from Monroe County and the Fire Department to FDIC, to release the lease and sublease, was sent to the Department of Natural Resources on March 27, 1989 for attorney review prior to closing. The legal description erroneously included all of Block 3, but Lots 1 through 8 were not part of the acquisition parcel.

On May 23, 1989, the Monroe County Board of County Commissioners approved Resolution 304-1989 requesting a 50-year lease from the Trustees "on that certain property upon which the Key Largo Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department has located its facility".

An Amended Purchase Agreement to close on 3.05 acres previously encumbered by the 99-year lease and to lease 0.5 acres to Monroe County was approved by the Trustees on June 27, 1989.

On June 5, 1990, the Assistant County Attorney transmitted a new Quit Claim Deed, from Monroe County to FDIC, to the Monroe County Board of County Commissioners for signature. Among other changes in form, this deed corrected the legal description to exclude Lots 1 through 8 of Block 3. The revised deed was executed and recorded in Official Records Book 1137, page 232.

The additional title problems were cured, and the Trustees acquired the portion of the Port Bougainville / Garden Cove tract that had been excluded from the initial closing, including the fire station, on January 28, 1992.

Lease 3671 between the Trustees and Monroe County began on July 7, 1993 for a term of 50 years. The stated purpose in Paragraph 4 of the lease is "...only for the establishment and operation of a fire station, along with other related uses necessary for the accomplishment of this purpose...". Unfortunately, the wrong legal description was attached to the lease. It appears that the description attached was from the Quit Claim Deed that was transmitted to the Department for review in March of 1989. Not only did the description include the conservation lands around the fire station, it included the eight lots in Block 3 that were not owned by the Trustees.

Correspondence shows that the conservation lands portion of the description was intended to be leased to the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) as part of the Crocodile Lakes National Wildlife Refuge. A 1994 Memorandum from the DEP Bureau of Land Management Services to USFWS states: "Based upon the amount of time that has passed in trying to resolve the issue of Monroe County's fire station lease, I would like to recommend that we finalize the lease you have in your possession. If the county agrees to release any portion of its lease, we can prepare an amendment to add the lands to your lease at a later date".

New Construction, Extended Term, and Assignment

On December 17, 2001, Fire Chief Sergio J. Garcia sent a letter to Governor Jeb Bush regarding new construction and expansion of the fire station. In the letter, the Chief describes the present physical location of the fire station as Lots 10-17, Block 5 and anticipated expansion onto Lots 46-53 of Block 5. The Chief requested that the Trustees either convey the property to the County or extend the lease. After correspondence with the Division of State Lands and onsite meetings with DEP and USFWS representatives regarding the undesirable impact on the adjacent Tropical Hammock, the Chief agreed to constrain the new construction to the current footprint and disturbed area as much as possible.

Presumably to help facilitate the new construction, Amendment 1 to the lease extended the term for the 50 years from May 19, 2004 to May 18, 2054.

In 2008, Monroe County assigned the lease to Key Largo Fire Rescue and Emergency Medical Services.

Lease Overlap with Recreation Lands

The Trustees acquired Lots 1 through 8 of Block 3 in 2003, as part of a larger improved parcel, from Intus Holding Ag, Inc. This parcel was leased to the DEP Division of Recreation and Parks (DRP) as part of the Florida Keys Overseas Heritage Trail creating an overlap in lease descriptions. An additional portion of Block 3 lying within a chain link fence was added to the DRP lease in 2009, compounding the overlap in lease descriptions.

Lease 3671 Land Use Plan

The Non-Conservation Land Use Plan for Lease 3672 approved on October 17, 2016 lists a lease area of 0.5137 acres and only pertains to the physical location of the existing fire station. It appears that there is no management plan for the conservation lands included in the lease description.

The tax map included in the Land Use Plan indicates Lots 8 through 16, Block 5. However, Lots 8 and 9 appear to be owned by Monroe County and are not a part of the lease description. Additionally, Lot 17 has long been considered as part of the fire station facility.

Recommendation / Conclusion

All of the lands included in the current lease description should be released by Key Largo Fire Rescue and Emergency Medical Services except for Lots 10 through 17 of Block 5 for the facility. The released lands, except for those included in the DRP lease, should be added to the USFWS lease for proper management of the conservation lands. 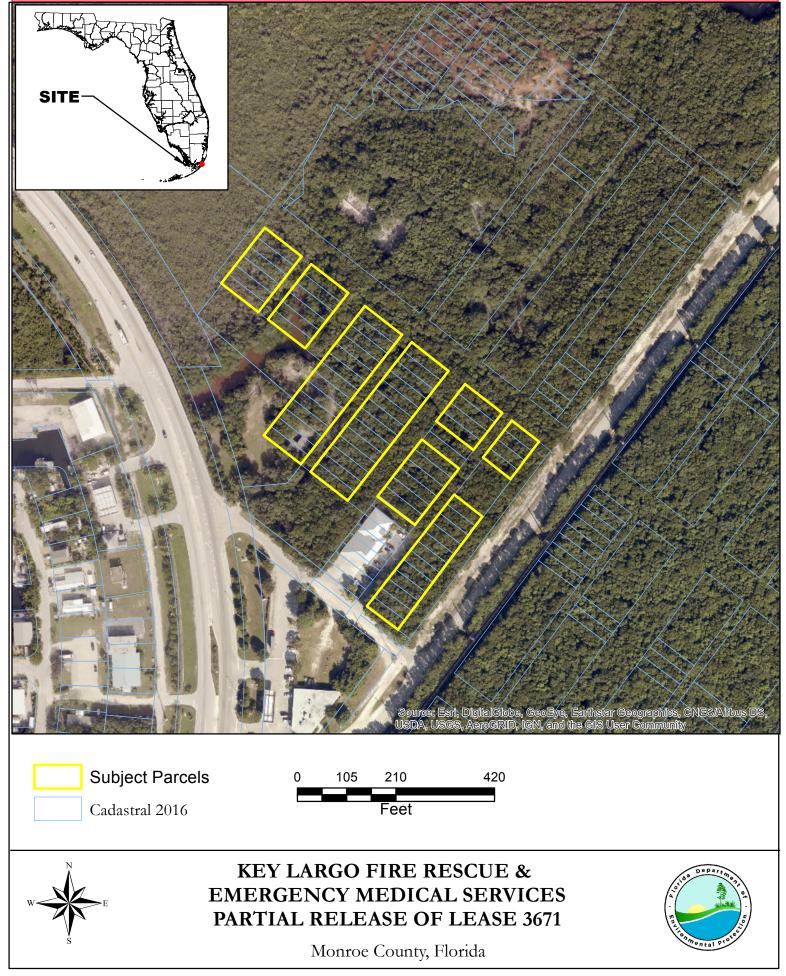

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY Α COMMISSIONERS OF MONROE COUNTY, FLORIDA, **EXPRESSING THE BOARD'S SUPPORT FOR THE KEY** LARGO FIRE & EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AND DISTRICT CALLING ON THE **FLORIDA** LEGISLATURE TO LEAVE THE DISTRICT INTACT AS AN INDEPENDENT SPECIAL DISTRICT THAT HAS A PRIMARY FOCUS OF PROTECTING THE HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE RESIDENTS OF AND VISITORS TO THE FLORIDA KEYS THROUGH THE **PROVISION OF FIRE PROTECTION AND FIREFIGHTING** SERVICES, RESCUE SERVICES AND EMERGENCY **MEDICAL SERVICES..**

WHEREAS, Monroe County, Florida is the southernmost county in the State of Florida and the continental United States and includes the unincorporated area of Key Largo, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Key Largo Fire Rescue & Emergency Medical Services District (hereinafter "KLFEMS") was created on June 8, 2005 when Governor Bush approved Florida Statute 2005-329 that created the 68th Special Fire Taxing District in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the KLFEMS provides fire protection, firefighting services, rescue services and emergency medical services for all of Cross Key and that part of Key Largo from South Bay Harbor Drive and Lobster Lane to the southern boundary of the right-of-way County Roads 905 and 905A; and

WHEREAS, the KLFEMS offers residents a higher-level of service at a lower cost, provides more direct control over revenue and expenses, streamlines existing work processes to reduce administrative tasks, and fosters volunteerism; and

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2022 the voters of the KLFEMS District approved a referendum allowing additional tax capacity. The referendum was overwhelmingly approved by a 63.14% vote of the KLFEMS District voters. This approval by voters is a further validation of the effectiveness and cost control in existence since the District was formed 18 years ago. During that 18 year span, the District has conservatively and successfully operated under a one mill tax assessment; and

WHEREAS, not every county in Florida enjoys the benefits of a professionally run, independent special district charged solely with the provision of fire protection and firefighting services, rescue services and emergency medical services; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Key Largo, Florida benefit from an independent special district focused solely on the provision of fire protection and firefighting services, rescue services and emergency medical services; and

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Commission has no desire to assume the duties of the KLFEMS; and

WHEREAS, if the duties of the KLFEMS were turned over to the Monroe County Commission, those responsibilities would compete for funding with the many other worthy priorities that the County Commission currently funds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MONROE COUNTY FLORIDA:

- 1. The recitals set forth above are incorporated as findings of fact of the Board.
- 2. The Board expresses its unqualified support for the Key Largo Fire Rescue & Emergency Medical Services District, its Board, and its staff; and
- 3. The Board urges the Florida Legislature to leave the fire protection, firefighting services, rescue services and emergency medical services for all of Cross Key and that part of Key Largo from South Bay Harbor Drive and Lobster Lane to the southern boundary of the right-of-way County Roads 905 and 905A in the more than capable hands of the Key Largo Fire Rescue & Emergency Medical Services District; and
- 4. The Clerk is directed to send this resolution to:
